




Outreach Activity

Central North Carolina Section ACS members Debbie Pritchard, Tim Ballard, and Robert A. Yokley conducted chemistry demonstrations at the North Carolina Leadership Academy (NCLA), a K-12 Charter School in Kernersville, NC, on April 19, 21, and 28. Demonstrations were selected to assist in explaining density and phase changes to three of Mrs. Elaine Delgado's 6th grade classes, physical versus chemical changes to three of Mrs. Tori Osborne's 8th classes, and the gas laws to two of Mrs. Kristen Williard's High School classes. The experiments ranged from simple indicator color changes to oscillating chemical clocks and were well received by the students based on their attentiveness as well as their engaging and thoughtful questions.

These chemistry demonstrations were a result of the ACS Science Coaches outreach program initiated last fall. Debbie, Tim, and Robert volunteered to serve as Science Coaches for three of the teachers at NCLA. Each teacher received a \$500 grant from the ACS (total of \$1500) for the school to purchase science supplies. During meetings with these three teachers, they indicated that they felt the best use of our Science Coach time was to perform chemistry demonstrations specifically designed to help students understand certain principles of chemistry and physical science. After much planning and preparation, the demonstrations were finally presented in April.

Debbie, Tim, and Robert wish to thank the CNC-ACS, the Silver Circle Group, and the ACS for supporting this work by helping purchase needed reagents, equipment, and supplies. We are also deeply indebted to Tim for allowing us to use his laboratory (En-Cas) and glassware to practice and prepare for these demonstrations. Perhaps these experiments can be presented to students at other schools in the Triad area in the future?


